



### A MESSAGE FROM THE CALLING LAKE COMMUNITY SOCIETY PRESIDENT

Hello all, I hope that cold snap has passed us! Let's sail into the spring months with no more minus 40!

I would encourage all community residents to become CLCS members, as we have an exciting new program for all homeowners, available in 2024. It is **Homeowners Safe and Secure** grant program. We will match up to \$200 to help you provide better home security. Details are listed on our Facebook page. All you need to do is the following. Be a member of the CLCS – its free. Decide what you would like to better secure your home. The application is available at the Post office or online and it is easy to fill out.

Safe and Secure committee recently had a meeting and now the work begins. With the help of our MLA, MD representatives, RCMP, local CLCS committee members we are pursuing both short term and long-term goals. Items being pursued are, increased street lighting (thank you MD for making this happen), community video surveillance (not property street traffic and inappropriate times), CLCS Home safe and secure grant program now available, assistance from the Sheriff's department, and a grant proposal analyzing crime in Calling Lake, all help lead us to a long term goal of a RCMP detachment here. (Which we will endeavor to make happen sooner than later).

I am really excited about our recent grant approval from the MD! With this funding Calling Lake will now have Community celebrations and activities year-round. You will see on our Facebook page a Calendar of events that are CLCS, Seniors, Bigstone, and MD. Many of these events are done in collaboration with each other.

The highlight of this will be a Canada Day / Community Celebration in Calling Lake! If you are interested in becoming involved with the planning and organizing, we will need volunteers in various roles. Just let us know you are willing to help by contacting a board member.

So as always, we would like people to read our guiding document, our Three-Year Plan, which is updated each year. You can find it on our Facebook page and our historical committees' website. 
